COMING SOON TO DUVALL!

The City of Duvall is designing a new sidewalk and bike lane to connect the north end of Main Street to Cherry Valley Road. The new pedestrian and bicycle facilities will be located on the east side of the road between Bird and Allen Streets and will complete a missing link between Downtown and Cherry Valley Elementary. The project is partially funded by a Transportation Improvement Board grant and will include a concrete wall along the existing steep slope east of Cherry Valley Road. As planned, the project will be constructed in late summer/early fall of 2013. Daytime road closures are anticipated to reduce overall construction time and a detour route will be posted on NE Virginia and 3rd Avenue during construction hours.
