HELP DUVALL KEEP STREETS CLEAR OF LEAVES AND PROTECT YOURSELF FROM FLOODING

Why? Clean storm drains help prevent localized flooding. City crews work to keep storm drains clear, but with 1,923 drains in Duvall we could use your help!

What are storm drains? Storm drains are rectangular grates with slats and are normally near the edge of the street.

What should I do with all the leaves?

- Check storm drain grates frequently to make sure they are free of leaves and debris.
- Do not remove the grate from the storm drain opening. This does not unclog the system and creates a hazard for everyone.
- Rake leaves away from storm drains near your house or business.
- Dispose of leaves in your yard waste container or compost bin.


